Must have a bachelors or master's in Education by December 2023; Elementary or Secondary Math or Language Arts preferred; State or Alaska certification a plus; Must be able to travel, be self-sufficient, flexible, open-minded, and adventurous; Must be able to lift and move 50 pounds; Interventionist must be able to read, understand, and apply student data to build meaningful student lessons with a focus in foundational skills in Reading and Math; Must possess excellent verbal, written and interpersonal communications skills; Must be able to act as a professional on and off the job; Must have a practical understanding of Response to Intervention (RTI); Must be able to develop awareness of local culture; Must be able to promote positive public relations for the school district.

Duties and Responsibilities:

 - a. January 1, 2024 to April 30, 2024; 4-month assignment; virtual December orientation
 - b. Paid travel to and from school site from nearest major airport to site
 - c. Fully furnished housing supplied; possibility of shared housing
 - d. 40 hours/week @ \$21/hour; must keep time via district time-clocks or timesheets
 - e. Performs required reporting and record keeping data; Analyze data, tracking progress, and evaluating program services
