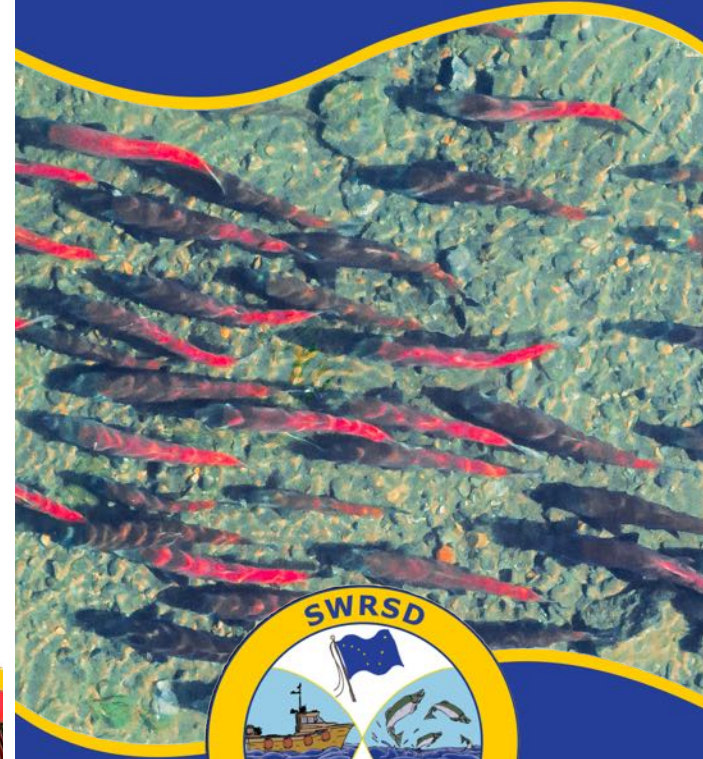

How does my child qualify?

To qualify, any or all of your children have to meet the following conditions:

- Traveled 20 miles one way or crossed school district boundaries to go commercial fishing, subsistence fishing, clamming or berry picking.
- Spent a total of 7 nights/8 days away from home doing 'qualifying' activities within a 12-month period (does not have to be consecutive nights).
- There is an economic need for the commercial or subsistence activities.
- Children ages birth to 20 (22 if the child is receiving special education services) can qualify for the program. However, once a child has graduated with a diploma, they no longer qualify for services.



Migrant Program Information & Facts

A primary goal of the migrant program is to increase literacy at home and assist in improving educational opportunities for migrant children to help meet the challenging state academic content, to graduate from high school, and be a responsible citizen of the community.

In the 2019-2020 there were 290 migratory children in Southwest Region School District; 40% of the student body population.

All eight schools within the district have a migrant coordinator that can help organize or provide contact information for possible services for migrant children.

In 2019-2020, over 10,000 books, 200 family games, and life jackets were sent to migrant family homes. Family nights were held at sites, some sites were affected school closures.

Program Services

- **Literacy at Home:** student selection (Dec-Mar), Alaska themed books & games send-out (Dec), Scholastic summer packs
- **At Home Activities:** Kiwi-crates (JanFebMar)
- **Family Nights:** Literacy and STEAM related activity nights (at least 2 per site per year)
- **School Readiness:** Kindergarten readiness kit; Early learning information on childhood learning and developmental milestones.
- **School Supplies/Readiness:** School supplies, reading & homework journals
- **9th/10th Life-Ready Academy:** life skills, college/career planning, mental health
- **PK-5th Grade Summer Slide:** reading, writing, math workbooks

Other Possible Services

- Targeted Tutoring/Interventions
- Career Exploration & Guidance
- Summer School
- Enrichment programs (ANSEP, Student Conservation Association, Student Gov't)
- College courses (dual-credit, in-school, out-of-school, & summer opportunities)
- Graduation Assistance
