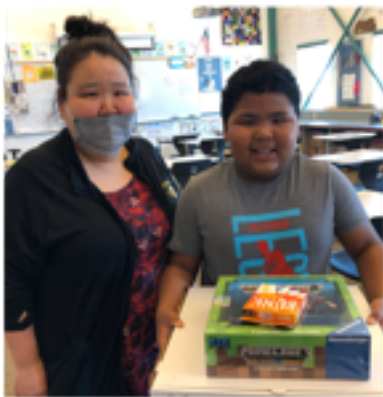
Family Fun for Everyone!

COVID-19 has kept large groups apart but brought families closer together more than ever before.

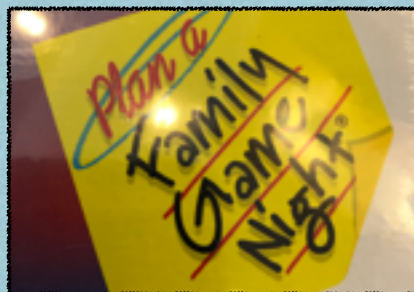
Family nights have always been full of fun up at the school but the disease has made us deal with a lot of changes. Many families had recently traveled and were in quarantines. Every Migrant Ed
