III. Approval of Agenda: Betty M. Wassily moved to approve the agenda. Seconded by Aurora George. Motion Carried.

IV. September 2nd 2008 Minutes: Betty M. Wassily moved to approve the minutes as is. Seconded by Aurora George. Motion Carried.

V. Guest Present: Present were Doug Bushey , Alyssa Bushey and Margaret Gardiner.

VI. Public Comment: Margaret Gardiner just wanted to say thank you to Doug for cleaning up our school and making it look better. Sharon said that it looks wonderful.

VII. Student Council Report:

1. Student Council: Cake Walk 9-15-08 We had a cake walk on September 15, 2008.
2. Financial Report: In the student account we have \$6682.25 and cash on hand we have \$620.00. The Student account has approximately \$6100 dollars plus store inventory. We will be spending approximately \$500.00 at afn for Halloween Prizes and Candy. Tonight we will have a money walk and Left Right Center. The student council asked for the advice of the CSC as what to charge for an admission fee. Entry fee will be \$1.00 per person. The costume contest will have 3 categories and 3 judges. The winners of the costume participants will receive \$3.00 in tickets and the winners will receive either \$5.00 in tickets of \$5.00 for the student store.

VIII. Principals Report:

1. Aluminum Cans Recycling-ALPAR-EPA: Doug asked the CSC if anyone would like to sit on a committee to head the can recycling. No one answered. Everybody started talking at once and the chairman declared point of order. Sharon said that she would have the IGAP assistant type up a memo to see if anyone would want to sit on a committee. Doug said that we would like the public to participate not only the school and the kids.

2. AFN Costs-

- a. Rental Car/Gas: It will be a three way split for the Mini vans between the Student Council, Nahasda and P/T Travel Budget. It will be about \$560.00 for three vans. Betty M. Wassily moved to approve the rental van and to be split three ways. Seconded by Anthony Clark. Motion Carried.

b. Admission Fees: On Wednesday we will be driving down to the Seward Sealife Center and the kids will be eating pizza down there for lunch. We are going to try to visit the museum and planetarium. Friday we will be going to visit Martin Bueser and he will have autographs signed for each student. On Saturday we will be at H2Oasis from 10:00 A.M. to 3:00 P.M.

3. Hire Recommendations: Margaret said today that she is withdrawing her extra hours for Sped of 12.5 hours a week, to work at the City as there is no employee in there now, and someone needs to clean up the mess. Doug is going to see if Diane is interested. Doug will talk to the personel office and see if it is wise just to repost the job opening. I have no recommendations at this point, but will have an update in November.

4. Outside Recess: Betty M. Wassily made a motion to allow the outside recess, but not to have it if more then 10 above with minimal wind and for it not to be Wet or Windy. Seconded by Anthony Clark. Motion Carried. Sharon asked that the Gym Rules be posted and carried out. Betty M. Wassily said that she was very upset when she came to see her mom and all the kids were in a circle and then they ended up in their own spot against the wall. She doesn't feel that everyone should be penalized for a child or a couple of childrens wrong doing. Aurora George said that that's how it used to be a long time ago and there is nothing wrong with it. Doug said that parents are open to come and supervise a recess so that they can get a birds eye view of what goes on, and that yelling sometimes occurs when a child is going to harm another or the gym is to noisey and no one can hear.

5. Library: Doug informed the council that he is going to have Margaret start cataloging the books in the library for a half hour a day. Margaret made the council and principal aware that if that task is going to be put on her that she will quit her job because since 1998 she has redone the entire library 5 times and that they should look into the budget to hire a librarian. Sharon Clark said that two years ago there was funding for a librarian for 2.5 hours a day, in which the postion was filled.

IX. Unfinished Business:

1. Wood Chipper: Anthony Clark said that he has to eat his words and that it should be the responsibility of the district to cut the trees around the school boundaries for the safety of the children in school. Doug let the council know that the wood chipper is here. Sharon said that it should be a priority for Curtis to cut the trees around the premises due to freeze up approaching us. Sharon said that maybe when all the kids are at AFN Curtis can cut the trees. Doug told Sharon that he has made a list of what needs to be done while the students are away. Sharon Clark said that she would paint the library on the weekend. Betty Wassily and Margaret Gardiner said they'd also help.

X. New Business

1. Teacher Housing Deck-Doug said that if there is scrap wood laying around in the village that he would like to build a deck around the two trailers and the playground this summer.
