Data

As a direct result from the parent survey, the school has started an incentive program to help improve attendance and celebrated students with improved attendance. There was the Camp Read A Lot family literacy event on in March. Additional family engagement events will be scheduled for the 4th quarter.

Other Data

- In December, 81% of students were on track to meet the attendance rate goal of 75% or higher.
- In March 84.6% of students were on track to meet the attendance rate goal of 75% or higher. That is an INCREASE!! YAY!!
